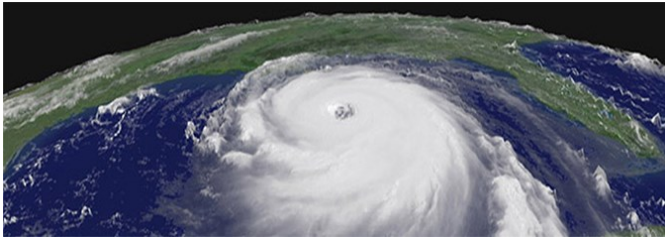

Emergency Management

Emergency Notification System

GREYHOUND ALERTS– Register for notifications through Everbridge. These send messages through text, email, and, if desired, voice.

BLUE LIGHT STATIONS– If you are unable to use your cellular device, the stations provide a direct line to Campus Police with your location. These are free standing poles as well as internal and external mounted boxes

ALERTUS– Notifications are sent to all screens in the University network, including digital signs, desktop computers, and projectors. Students can install the software on their personal devices by contacting Tech Services.

LIVESAFE APP– Make anonymous reports, connect to campus police, send photos and videos, and have a virtual escort
