

MASTER OF EDUCATION IN KODÁLY MUSIC EDUCATION

The Master of Education in Kodály Music Education includes 36 credits at four levels. Students complete their levels during four consecutive summer sessions—three-week sessions for Levels I-III and a four-week session for Level IV. Students receive their Kodály certification following successful completion of Level III and the retrieval system project, and their master's degree following successful completion of Level IV.

Each of the first three levels includes four courses: Solfa (Sight Singing and Ear Training), Kodály Pedagogy, Kodály Materials (Songs and Games, Folk Instruments, Retrieval System), and Choral Studies (Conducting and Choir). A Secondary Choral Pedagogy track is available for choral directors. Level IV consists of the following three core education courses: Foundations of Educational Research, Teaching Students with Special Needs, and Advanced Studies in Music Education. These courses are designed to broaden the student's knowledge of research and trends in the field of education, and are specifically geared toward practical applications in the music class. All applicants complete a Solfa Skills Assessment test to gauge their sight singing and ear training skills.


