- 1855 College moves to Calvert Street location
- 1921 Established Evergreen Campus
- 1949 Graduate studies begin with Education programs
- 1971 Becomes coeducational following a merger with Mount Saint Agnes College
- 2009 Adopts Loyola University Maryland designation
